
JCLC/STEM CAMP

SCRIPPS INSTITUTE OF OCEANOGRAPHY

Cadets had the chance to learn about various marine microorganisms at the Scripps Institute of Oceanography (SIO). They were able to talk to professionals and get to experience using equipment and tactics that are used by those professionals on a daily basis. Cadets collected their own specimens and did research regarding their living conditions and how and why it matters. One amazing piece of equipment that the cadets were able to utilize was a Thermo camera - they were all given 5-10 minutes to walk around and learn more about the different temperatures for daily things surrounding us such as trees and people. We hope that this sparked an interest in the field of Marine Biology, and inspired cadets to pursue careers relating to this pathway!

All cadets had a fun time experiencing this training and learning how to save a life in case of an emergency!






CYBERPATRIOTS
